

**Education Faculty in Four Areas**  
**Bard Master of Arts in Teaching Program - Delano, CA**

Bard College Master of Arts in Teaching Program in Delano, California is seeking education faculty for this newly established campus in all of the following areas - adolescent literacy, cognition and learning, adolescent development, and curriculum and instruction. Bard's MAT program is committed to rigorous graduate training in mathematics, biology, history and English; early and intense involvement in the high school classroom; partnerships for educational change with participant schools; and a re-conceptualized education curriculum.

With the support of the Resnick Foundation and the Paramount Agricultural Companies, the Bard MAT Program in Delano will be integrated with the Paramount Bard Academy, a charter school proposed to open in August 2009 and serving grades 6-12 in its first five years and K-12 in the following years. Graduate and public school faculty will share a common campus, working together to establish a model educational community for public school students while educating teachers as leaders for educational change. In an effort to educate teachers who will develop better practices for classroom learning, Bard's MAT emphasizes a unique integration of advanced studies in an academic field, graduate courses in key educational areas, and ongoing experiences in public school classrooms throughout the year. This new campus offers a unique opportunity for graduate faculty and students to contribute to a model, linking theory and practice in the context of the daily operations of the Paramount Bard Academy. For this reason, the MAT program requires a high degree of faculty collaboration and we seek full-time faculty who share our commitments.

The successful candidate will have a Ph.D. or Ed.D. with expertise in any one of four areas (listed above) as well as previous teaching experience in the public schools. Teaching begins in June 2009. Applications will be accepted immediately and hiring will be carried out on a rolling basis with interviews beginning February 20, 2009. Salary is competitive and commensurate with experience.
